This family picnic event, in commemoration of the Ida Lake Association's fifteenth anniversary, is scheduled at Pilgrims Point for Saturday, July 23 from 1 to 5 p.m. and is limited to current 2005 paid members and immediate family. We will be serving brats and hot dogs off the grill, bags of potato chips, baby carrots cookies, and a beverage at no charge to members. Vehicle parking is somewhat limited so car-pooling with neighbors is suggested, or weather permitting, come by boat. There is a sand volleyball court, playground equipment for the kids, and a lifeguard monitored swimming area. The camp and we are not authorizing swimming anywhere but at the monitored swimming area. ## **CURLEY LEAF PONDWEED:**

This aquatic weed has been found in Lake Ida along with twenty other lakes within Douglas County. Jed Anderson, DNR aquatic plant specialist has no knowledge as to who found the weed or the location in the lake. He stated that he is not surprised at the presence of the weed in the lake and that he believes most lakes, ponds, sloughs, and wetlands in the area are infested. He suggested that the monitoring of the lake should be on going to assess any expansion. The DNR personnel will help to determine the location of the weed and check their records for further information. Our objective should be to and locate pondweed, estimate the area infested, monitor any expansion and possible eradication, which may take several years to accomplish. The DNR representative said that 2-3 acres could be treated effectively with chemicals selective to pondweed without harming native vegetation. The cost for professional application is about \$250.00 per acre. The Lake Le Homme Dieu Association has started an eradication program this year and we can follow their efforts.

# **IDA LAKE ASSOCIATION GOLF OUTING:**

The Ida Lake Association golf outing is planned for Saturday, August 6 with tee times starting at 3 p.m. The event will be held at Nordic Trails golf course, 4343 County Road 20 NE, located north of Alexandria just off County road 29. Their phone number is 320-762-5420.
