Worm Spraying

• This looks like a bad year for army worms. Ida Lake Association will be spraying where districts have requested spraying, release forms have been signed and there is evidence of worm infestation. A release form is included with this newsletter. Please sign and return it. If your area does not need spraying, none will be done. If you do NOT want your lot sprayed, please let us know right away. This also means that your neighbors on either side will also not be sprayed. If you have not already done so, please sign a form either way and send it to the address given.

TEMPORARY STRUCTURE PERMITS

• If you plan on placing a structure in a lake, river or waterway (other than a dock or boat lift) within Douglas County for a period of time greater than one day (sunrise to sunset), you are required to first obtain a Temporary Structure Permit issued by the Sheriff's Office. Some permits are valid for three years, some are renewed annually, please note the specific regulations of each permit. The most common types of structures that require a permit are swim/dive rafts, water trampolines, designated swim areas, mooring buoys, boarded ice skating rinks, water ski, and wake board or jet ski courses. Serious Reminder: (Burning)

As you begin Spring and Fall work on your yard, please remember that the Douglas
County Ordnance prohibits burning within 100 feet of the ordinary high water level of a
general development and recreational development lake. The only exception would be a
recreational wood burning campfire with a fire ring less than three feet in diameter,
designed to enclose ash for removal.

If any amount of burning is done (other than a recreational campfire) a fire permit must be obtained. EPA doesn't allow burning of any garbage including paper and cardboard. Only allowed burning would be vegetative matter such as leaves, brush, and unpainted and unstained wood.

Home owners are responsible for smoke control. If you are burning, and the wind changes, and smoke is going to a neighbor's home, you must immediately Stop Burning.

LEAVES AND GRASS

• PLEASE DO NOT DEPOSIT LEAVES OR GRASS INTO THE LAKE OR DITCHES. THESE ARE POLLUTANTS AND ALSO CONTRIBUTE TO INCREASED LEVELS OF PHOSPHORUS AND TO EXCESS ALGAE AND WEED GROWTH.
