President Dian Lopez opened meeting at 9:05 am

Secretary's Report. Barb Kilgore read the minutes of the **August 27, 2011**. Andy Lopez pointed out an error in the item regarding the newsletter on page 2. Fish Stocking. Bill Sandstrom reported that the DNR did the electro shocking and the results were poor. The DNR will only stock the lake with fingerlings every other year, and since they did Lake Ida last year they won't stock any this year. The Chamber of Commerce through the Viking Sportsman will match a percentage of what the ILA spends on stocking.
